SMITH: Maybe I am not making myself clear. apologize if I'm not, but Lisa, did you go to Randy and 8 and say to Randy that Joe was doing something but 9 10 whatever you said to him was untrue; that he wasn't 11 really doing that? THE WITNESS: He wasn't -- the only thing I said to 12 13 Randy was just that what had happened on that day, and I 14 asked him what I should have done about it. 15 THE COURT: Did I understand it to be Randy Anderson; that's what you just explained to me when I 16 17 asked you about the circumstances? 18 THE WITNESS: Yes. 19 MR. SMITH: Yes, Judge. May I have him brought in 20 the courtroom? THE COURT: Lisa, you go wait in the courtroom 21 22 across the hallway where you were sitting before. 23 JOSEPH LOUIS THEROUX, having first been duly sworn, 24 testified as follows: 25 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR.
